  - 4.1 It will make it a lot harder for me to pay for a lawyer.
  - 4.2 It will also cause delays in repairing the damage that has been caused.
  - 4.3 Delays in repairing this damage may mean the existing building permit expires, and additional costs will be incurred to extend the existing building permit and / or to get a new building permit.
  - 4.4 Delays in repairing this damage also delay my ability to sell my house.
  - 4.5 Delays in selling my house is costing me over \$1,700 per month in mortgage payments.
  - 4.6 Delays in selling my house are stopping me from living and working in Port Lincoln.
